- If you have GIC insurance, you should call the pre-notification number on the back of your insurance card and inform GIC of your upcoming procedure.


Screening length varies per individual patient needs. Please allow approximately 45 minutes for completion of the phone screen.

Please have the following information ready for your phone screen:

- A list of current medications and dosages (including vitamins and over-thecounter medications)
- Name and phone number of your Primary Care Physician & Specialist(s), (e.g. Cardiologist)
- Contact information for obtaining cardiac testing which may have been done in past 5 years, such as EKG, echocardiogram, stress tests, heart catheterization
- Small identification card for medical devices: (For patients with pacemakers, defibrillators, &/or cardiac stent cards, or any implantable devices (e.g. nerve stimulator)

What is a Drug-induced Sleep Endoscopy (DISE)?



Drug-induced sleep endoscopy (DISE) is a procedure used for studying the relaxation of throat muscles in a sedated person with obstructive sleep apnea (OSA). An anesthesiologist will give you a medicine in your veins which will make you fall asleep within a few minutes. Once asleep, the doctor will insert a small tube with a video camera through your nostrils to examine the back of your throat (upper airway) and nearby possible regions that can cause OSA. This procedure required to see if you qualify for an implant to treat sleep apnea.

Please follow these instructions in preparation for your procedure:

- Please consult with your primary care physician or your provider if you are taking insulin or other diabetic medications. These medications may need to be adjusted prior to your procedure.
- Consult your primary care physician or your provider about any blood thinners such as Coumadin/Warfarin, Plavix, heparin, Lovenox, Eliquis (apixaban), Xarelto (rivaroxaban), Pradaxa (dabigatran) since these usually will need to be discontinued prior to your procedure and you may need special instructions.
- Do not eat any solid food of any kind after midnight prior to the procedure.
- You may drink clear liquids after midnight up until 3 hours before your procedure. Clear liquids could include tea, coffee (no dairy/milk), clear juices (NO RED FLAVORS), (NO Broth), popsicles, and Jell-O.
- You may take your other medications with a sip of water unless otherwise instructed. You should make sure you take your cardiac medications such as beta blockers (i.e.: Metoprolol, Atenolol, Carvedilol) on the morning of the procedure.
- Arrive 1 hour before your scheduled exam time (For 7 AM Exams only, arrive at 6:30 AM)
- You will be discharged approximately 3 hours after your arrival time. In order for your procedure to be performed, you must arrange for a responsible adult to meet you at the Gregory Endoscopy Centre to sign you out and either drive you home or accompany you in a taxi/ride share/public transportation. The responsible adult cannot be the taxi driver or ride share driver. You will not be discharged until your ride arrives.
