



If you need to reschedule your appointment, please call 617-983-7017 and follow the recorded prompts.

Items Needed to be Purchased from Your Pharmacy:

You will not need to purchase any items from the pharmacy.

Two Weeks Before Procedure:

- Consult your primary care physician if you are taking insulin or other diabetic medications. Your dose will need to be adjusted on the day before and/or morning of procedure.
- Consult your primary care physician for blood thinners such as Coumadin/Warfarin, Plavix, Xarelto as they require dose adjustments prior to your procedure.
- Please bring your card if you have a pacemaker or defibrillator.

Day of Procedure:

- Do not eat solid food of any kind after midnight.
- **You may drink clear liquids after midnight and until 4 hours before your procedure.**
- Clear liquids consist of:
 - **Broths:** *clear bouillon, chicken, vegetable or beef.*
 - **Beverages, etc:** *tea, coffee (no dairy cream/milk), Kool-Aid, carbonated beverages, clear juices like apple or cranberry, Italian Ices, popsicles, Jello. (NO RED FLAVORS)*
- Patients taking beta blockers such as Metoprolol or Atenolol, or medicines for a seizure disorder, should take their medications as prescribed on the morning of the exam.
- Arrive 1 hour before your scheduled exam time (**FOR 7 AM EXAMS ONLY, arrive at 6:30**).
- You will be discharged approximately 3 hours after arrival time. **In order for your procedure to be performed, you must arrange for a responsible adult to meet you at the Gregory Endoscopy Centre to sign you out and either drive you home or accompany you in a taxi/Uber/on public transportation** (responsible adult cannot be the taxi/Uber driver). You will not be discharged until your ride arrives.
