Sue was focused on patient safety and quality assurance, in her personal life as a ski patroller as well as in her professional life, spearheading numerous patient safety initiatives at BWFH. Sue's participation on several interdisciplinary committees shed light on the vital role of ancillary services in patient care. Sue was a champion for all patients and was the recipient of the Norman Sadowsky Award for Excellence prior to her death from breast cancer in 2008.
