Patient Safety Highlight of the Month: Unsecured medical equipment



Recently, 6 North staff nurse Kaitlyn Graham, BSN, RN, noticed an IV start kit, which included tourniquets, an IV catheter and a blood culture container, had been left unattended in her patient's room. Graham was aware of her patient's previous substance abuse issues and that her patient was previously suspected of tampering with IV equipment and thus removed the equipment from the room. After being notified of Graham's discovery, 6 North Nurse Director Suzelle Saint-Eloi, MS, RN, reviewed the importance of not leaving unsecured medical equipment, such as sharps and syringes,

unattended in a patient's room with her staff. Thanks to Graham's heightened awareness around patient safety, she removed supplies from the environment that could be a potential risk and ensured her patient was safe during his admission. Read this and other Patient Safety Highlights here.
